Gestalt psychology or gestaltism (/ ɡ ɛ ʃ ˈ t ɔ ː l t, - ɡ ɛ ʃ ˈ t ɔ ː l t, - ɡ ɛ ʃ ˈ t ɔ ː l t, - ɡ ɛ ʃ ˈ t ɔ ː l t /; from German: Gestalt [ɡ ɛ ʃ ˈ t a l t] "shape, form") is a philosophy of mind of the Berlin School of experimental psychology. Gestalt psychology is an attempt to understand the laws behind the ability to acquire and maintain meaningful perceptions in an apparently chaotic world. Friedrich Nietzsche developed his philosophy during the late 19th century. He owed the awakening of his philosophical interest to reading Arthur Schopenhauer's *Die Welt als Wille und Vorstellung* (The World as Will and Representation, 1819, revised 1844) and said that Schopenhauer was one of the few thinkers that he respected, dedicating to him his essay *Schopenhauer als Erzieher* (Schopenhauer ... He was born in Burlington, Vermont, on 20 October 1859. Dewey graduated from the University of Vermont in 1879, and received his PhD from Johns Hopkins University in 1884. Considered by some to be the greatest philosopher of the 20th century, Ludwig Wittgenstein played a central, if controversial, role in 20th-century analytic philosophy.
